Team GBH Cardiac Rescues: Pregnant Woman's Life Saved in Cardiac ICU

Udaipur: In a remarkable incident, a pregnant woman was successfully treated for heart failure and underwent a normal delivery at GBH Cardiac General Hospital in Bedwas. The surprising aspect was that both the mother and the baby were in danger, but the doctors delivered them safely in the cardiac ICU.



Bhagwati Devi (30), a resident of Jalore, had been experiencing continuous respiratory distress due to heart failure. The woman was seven months pregnant. Her family took her to a nearby hospital, but she did not find any relief, and her

condition deteriorated during the journey. She was brought to the emergency department of GBH Cardiac General Hospital in Bedwas with the help of oxygen provided in the

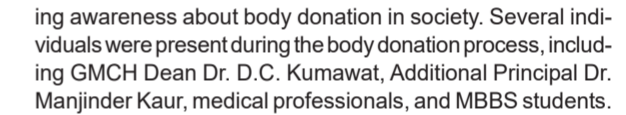
ambulance. Dr Payal Jain from the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology was called for immediate assistance. At that time, the pregnant woman had an oxygen level of only 80 per cent, posing a risk to both the fetus and the mother. Interventional cardiologist Dr Danny Manglani was summoned to the emergency as symptoms of heart failure were observed. She was shifted to the cardiac ICU, and a normal delivery was performed with the help of a ventilator.

During labour pain, Dr Payal Jain, Dr Avinash Bothra (Pediatrician), and Dr Danny Manglani, with their team, decided that shifting the pregnant woman to the labour room from the ventilator posed a risk. Thus, an artificial labour room was set up in the cardiac ICU, where an expected delivery was safely conducted. The newborn faced complications due to preterm birth and being underweight. She experienced frequent breathing difficulties, vomiting after feeding, and stomach bloating. Under Dr Avinash Bothra's and the team's supervision, she was shifted to the NICU (Neonatal Intensive Care Unit) and received treatment for 38 days. After the treatment, her weight increased by 1.5 kilograms, and she was discharged.

Explaining the reason behind the woman's distress, Dr Danny Manglani, the cardiologist, stated that during pregnancy, hormonal changes often weaken the heart. In such situations, the pregnant woman's oxygen level dropped to only 80 per cent, and her heart was functioning at only 10 per cent. This condition can be hazardous and is referred to as peripartum cardiomyopathy in medical science. The mother's heart pumping capacity improved to 25 per cent after delivery. She was receiving medication for her heart and was discharged without surgical procedures.

The Gift of Body Donation

Udaipur. Late Smt. Lalita Puri, a 75-year-old resident of Sector-14 in Udaipur, had been battling liver and heart ailments for the past eight years. Unfortunately, she recently passed away. However, her son, Mr. Vikas Puri, fulfilled her last wish by donating her body to Udaipur's Geetanjali Medical College and Hospital (GMCH). Mrs. Puri had expressed her desire for body donation whenever her health deteriorated over the last five years. She believed that if her body could be useful even after her death, it would contribute to medical research and the training of future doctors.



Dr Prakash K.G, the Head of the Department of Anatomy at GMCH, stated that Mrs. Lalita Puri's wish was successfully fulfilled by her son, emphasizing the importance of raising awareness about body donation in society. Several individuals were present during the body donation process, including GMCH Dean Dr. D.C. Kumawat, Additional Principal Dr. Manjinder Kaur, medical professionals, and MBBS students.

In addition to Mrs. Puri, registrations for body donation were also made by Mr. Indra Lal Porwal and his wife Mrs. Manju Porwal, as well as Shri Shankar Lal Kumawat and his wife Mrs. Usha Kumawat. These individuals were willing to donate their bodies after their demise, recognizing the significance of contributing to scientific advancement and medical education.

Body donation is a noble act that serves various purposes. Donating one's body after death is a priceless gift to the progress of science. The donors' bodies are used for teaching, providing valuable practical experience to future doctors, nurses, and surgeons. They also facilitate medical research and advancements in the healthcare field. Anyone Indian citizen above 18 years of age and capable of giving legally valid consent can register as a whole body donor at the Department of Anatomy at GMCH Udaipur. In cases where individuals are not registered but have legal rights over the deceased's body, their family guardians can decide to donate the body.

Individuals can contact the anatomy department of Geetanjali Medical College for more information about body donation. Prateem Tamboli, the CEO of GMCH, expressed his gratitude to the late Mrs. Lalita Puri's family for fulfilling her final wish and commended the courage of Mr and Mrs Porwal for their decision to register as body donors.

"C.P.S. Celebrates Hariyali Amavasya Mela as Monsoon Festival"

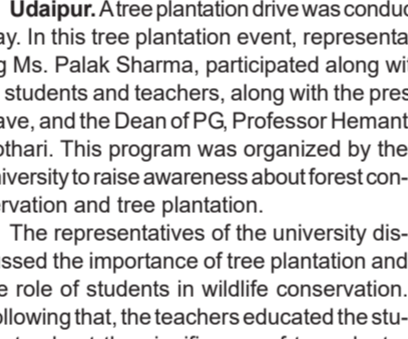

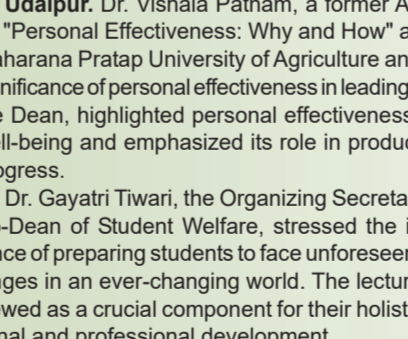
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Student Dialogue Program Commemorates World Population Day



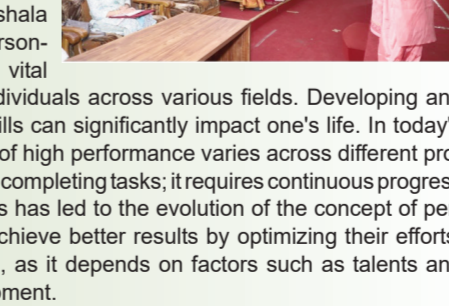

Unleashing Personal Effectiveness: Keynote



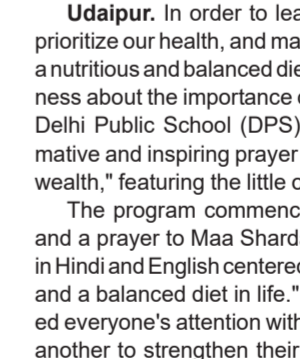

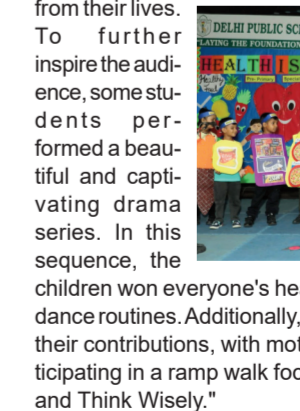
