Additionally, coaching classes are held every year for 5th-grade students from local schools to help them gain admission to Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas.

In the realm of community health development, the foundation organizes health camps and provides medical facilities through mobile medical units to 28 selected villages, treating over 40,000 OPD cases annually.

Furthermore, under the livelihood development program, the foundation has

established a women farmer producer organization to increase income through dairy collection activities.

More than 550 women shareholders are involved in this initiative, which collects 4,500 to 5,000 liters of milk daily, sent to the Amul plant. This program provides employment to over 500 families daily. The horticulture development program, which plants more than 5,000 saplings annually, has already begun to bear fruit for local farmers, promising increased income in the

future.

The Adani Foundation also undertakes infrastructure development activities such as building classrooms in local schools, constructing CC roads, and installing tube wells. The foundation's ongoing efforts are frequently praised by the government, boosting the morale of the team and accelerating their work.

Successful Operation for Mandibular Fracture and Benign Bone Tumor at PIMS Umarada

Udaipur: Doctors at Pacific Institute of Medical Sciences (PIMS) Hospital, Umarada, have successfully performed an operation for a mandibular fracture and benign bone tumor.

Chairman Ashish Agarwal reported that on July 12, Maheshchandra, a patient from Banswara district, came to the dental department at PIMS Hospital Umarada with injuries sustained from a road traffic accident 12-15 days prior. Despite visiting various hospitals in Banswara, Sagwara, Udaipur, and Jaipur, he had not received any treatment. The patient's relatives approached Dr. Ajeet Joshi (MDS - Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon), Professor and Head of the Dental Department at PIMS, to inquire if the surgery could be performed at their hospital.



Dr. Joshi requested the patient to report to the department with all relevant documents. After a thorough examination, it was found that the patient had a rare condition affecting the facial bones, known as Fibrous Dysplasia (benign tumor). This condition, caused by genetic imbalance, involves the replacement of solid bone parts with fibrous tissue. Although it is caused by genetic imbalance, there is no literature reporting hereditary cases. The condition causes the bone to expand and grow irregularly throughout life. The patient had previously undergone surgery to reduce the zygomatic bone about 5-6 years ago, but it had regrown to its current size.

The patient had a fracture in the mandibular region (left parasymphseal area) and several other minor injuries, exacerbated by the fibrous dysplasia. Despite the challenges posed by this benign tumor, which made the operation complex, the patient was admitted and underwent a successful free surgery under the Ayushman scheme. Dr. Joshi and his team performed the surgery on July 15, and the patient was discharged from the hospital on July 25. The patient has been placed on regular follow-up for further management at the dental department, PIMS Umarada.

Independence Day Celebrations Held with Grandeur at PMU

Fish Bone Successfully Removed Through Endoscopy

Udaipur: At Geetanjali Medical College Hospital, Udaipur, a 20-year-old patient was saved by the diligent efforts of Dr. Pankaj Gupta, Dr. Dhaval Vyas, and Dr. Manish Dodmani from the Gastroenterology Department. The patient had accidentally swallowed a sharp 5 cm fish bone, which lodged in the esophagus, causing severe complications. After being referred to Dr. Pankaj by ENT specialist Dr. Nitin Sharma, an endoscopy was performed, and the bone was successfully removed. The patient is now fully recovered and eating normally. Dr. Pankaj advised caution when consuming sharp objects and emphasized the advanced resources available at Geetanjali Hospital for complex cases.

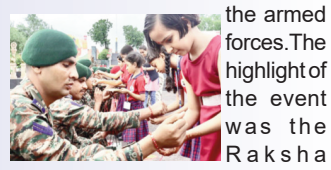
