47-Day Silk Exhibition Begins, Shoppers Explore 80 Stalls

Udaipur: The third Silk of India exhibition, organized by Shri Krishna Arts and Craft, was inaugurated today. The exhibition features 80 stalls showcasing products from various regions across the country.

Director of Shri Krishna Arts and Craft, Yogendra Singh, shared that the exhibition includes a variety of products such as Kolkata sarees, Asma silk, Bhagalpuri silk, dress materials, Khadi kurtas and shirts from Meerut, bedsheets from Khakra, fashion jewelry from Mumbai, Madhubani paintings, Banarasi silk sarees, cotton suits from Delhi, Kashmiri art, Kashmiri silk, dry fruits from Kashmir, Rajasthani Bandhani sarees, Bagru cotton shirts, Saharanpur furniture, and Khurja pottery, among others.

Shyam Singh Naruka mentioned that over 1,000 products are available under one roof at the exhibition. Several weavers have also set up stalls to display their products. Notably, there are 12 stalls dedicated exclusively to silk, including a ₹50,000 Patola silk saree.

The exhibition is scheduled to run for 47 days, and the organization conducts eight such exhibitions annually.



Senior Advocates to Strategize Strengthening Udaipur High Court Bench Movement



Widespread Resentment Among Udaipur Advocates Over Minister Jogaram Patel's Statement

Udaipur (Dr. Munesh Arora): Former Speaker of the Rajasthan Assembly, Shantilal Chaplot, has strongly responded to Rajasthan's Law Minister Jogaram Patel's statement, asserting that the movement for establishing a High Court

bench in Udaipur will continue. Chaplot emphasized the necessity of a High Court bench for the Mewar region, stating that residents of tribal areas cannot travel to Jodhpur for justice. A new action plan for the movement is under consideration.

Senior advocate Arun Vyas labeled Patel's statement as a betrayal of the Udaipur division. He pointed out that advocates in Udaipur have been striving for a High Court bench for 44 years, yet the government has failed to address their legitimate demand. Vyas asserted that efforts to intensify the movement would be undertaken soon. Senior advocate Ramesh Nandwana expressed disappointment with Patel's remarks, deeming them

a blow to the rights of tribal people. He highlighted the urgent need for a High Court bench in Udaipur to serve tribal interests and announced plans to discuss the issue with fellow advocates. Nandwana also criticized Udaipur's politicians for their lack of support.

Senior advocate Shambhu Singh Rathore expressed deep dismay over the minister's comments, describing them as a betrayal of the people of Udaipur. Rathore questioned how long citizens would have to stage protests to access justice. Despite four decades of struggle, the people of Udaipur have only received empty promises. He urged local politicians to introspect and act in the public's interest.

Minister's Justification for

No New Benches

Earlier, Law Minister Jogaram Patel stated in an exclusive interview that efforts are being made to strengthen Rajasthan's judicial system to ensure speedy justice. He argued that ongoing strikes in various districts demanding High Court benches should cease, as lawyers can now file cases electronically without needing to appear in person. Patel claimed the state has entered a new digital era, rendering the demand for new High Court benches and virtual courts obsolete.

He further revealed that ₹700 crore has been invested in enhancing the judiciary's system, enabling lawyers to file cases paperlessly and participate in court proceedings from



their homes or offices. Patel dismissed any plans to establish new High Court benches or virtual courts in Rajasthan.

Regarding Union Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal's announcement about setting up virtual High Court benches in Bikaner, Kota, and Udaipur, Patel claimed no knowledge of such plans, stating that no proposals are under consideration. The law minister

added that steps are being taken to reduce case pendency in the judiciary, with efforts to fill vacant judge positions and expedite hearings of old cases. He emphasized the significant role of lawyers in achieving timely justice.

Present during the interview were former Speaker and ex-Law Minister Shantilal Chaplot and BJP city general secretary Gajpal Singh Rathore.

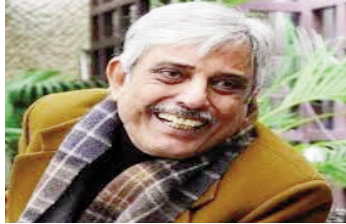

Jodhpur to Host Army Recruitment Rally from 5th December

Jaipur: The Indian Army's Southern Command is set to conduct its second phase of recruitment rallies, with the first event scheduled to take place in Jodhpur from December 5th to 14th, 2024. This rally will be open to candidates aspiring for roles as Agniveers in General Duty, Technical, Office Assistant/SKT, and Tradesmen categories (both 8th and 10th pass).

Subsequently, another rally is planned from December 16th to 19th, 2024, exclusively for female candidates interested in joining the Women Military Police. Both rallies will be held at the Rajkiya Sharirik Shiksha Mahavidyalaya in Jodhpur.

Approximately 8,000 candidates, shortlisted from the Common Entrance Exam 2024, have received call-up notices for these recruitment rallies. Admit cards are available online through the Join Indian Army website.

Sarpanch representative Bhanwar Lal Gurjar reported that 5-6 bighas of land near the village were reclaimed and handed over to the Gram Panchayat. The land, Plot No. 2300, has been designated for the construction of a plant nursery.

The operation was led by Deputy Tehsildar Nandlal Joshi, with support from RI Devaraj Singh, Patwari Kamlesh Sharma, Extension Officer Lalit Gurjar, and Ghassa Police Officer Babulal Jeengar, ensuring full security. The effort began when Sarpanch Pushpadevi Gurjar voluntarily removed her own illegal boundary wall, setting an example. The encroachments by Devi Lal (son of Hiralal Gurjar), Devi Lal (son of Nanalal Gurjar), Pyari Bai, and Vagta Ram were demolished. Sarpanch Pushpadevi Gurjar thanked the administration for their support in this initiative.
