High Court Bench Movement to Become More Effective: Chandra Bhan Singh Shaktawat

"Efforts Will Be Made to Allocate DMG Premises and Collector's Residence for Court Expansion"

Udaipur: In a significant victory, Chandra Bhan Singh Shaktawat defeated his closest rival. Chetanpuri Goswami. to become the newly elected President of the Udaipur Bar

Association. In an exclusive interview, Shaktawat shared his priorities, emphasizing that the movement for establishing a High Court bench in Udaipur will be revitalized and made more impactful. Shaktawat stated, "The cur-

is not a feasible location for common citizens or senior advocates to visit daily. Efforts will be made to allocate the Collector's residence and the DMG premises for court expan-

This would resolve many existing issues in the court complex. Relocating the DMG office to another part of the city will not have a significant impact, but asking people to travel to Balicha for justice would be both costly and inconvenient, with limited transport facilities.'
