NEET Exam on May 4, Online Applications Begin

The National Testing Agency (NTA) has commenced the application process for NEET UG 2025, India's premier medical entrance examination. The exam is scheduled for May 4, 2025, in a single session from 2:00 PM to 5:00 PM, conducted in pen-and-paper mode. Aspiring candidates can submit their applications via the official NTA website until March 7, 2025.

Eligibility and Courses: NEET UG is mandatory for admission into undergraduate medical programs such as MBBS, BDS, BAMS, BHMS, BYMS, BSMS, Military Nursing Services BSc, and four-year nursing courses. Candidates must be at least 17 years old by December 31 of the admission year; there is no upper age

Foreign applicants: ₹9,500

The 3-hour exam comprises 180 questions: 45 each from Physics and Chemistry, and 90 from Biology (Botany and Zoology), totaling 720 marks. Each correct answer awards 4 marks, while 1 mark is deducted for incorrect responses. Important Dates

The exam will be available in 13 languages, including English Hindi, Assamese, Bengali, Gujarati, Kannada, Malayalam, Marathi, Odia, Punjabi, Tamil, Telugu, and Urdu. Indian citizens and Overseas Citizens of India (OCI) aiming to study medicine abroad must qualify NEET UG for eligibility in India's licensing process. 
