Scientists Commit to Edible Oil Self-Reliance

Udaipur: Agricultural scientists have pledged to make India self-sufficient in edible oils under the National Edible Oil Mission, a ₹10,103 crore initiative approved by the Union Cabinet. The mission, spanning 2024-2031, aims to boost oilseed production from 39 million to 69.7 million tons.

At the "Peanut-2025" National Conference, held at Rajasthan Agricultural College, Udaipur, Dr. Ajit Kumar Karnataka, Vice Chancellor of MPUAT, emphasized pre-breeding research to expand the peanut genetic base and develop climate-resilient, nutrient-rich varieties. He urged the adoption of GIS, GPS, AI/ML, and drones for pest and disease monitoring in peanut farming.Dr. D.K. Yadav, Deputy Director-General (ICAR), stressed the need for highyielding, disease-resistant peanut varieties, while Dr. Sanjeev Gupta, Assistant Director-General (ICAR), highlighted the potential of peanuts in reducing India's 57% edible oil imports.
